Writer, Director, Producer, and Editor Ashley Avis will take aspiring filmmakers through the step-by-step process of the creation of a real film, utilizing Disney's BLACK BEAUTY as an example of process: from creative vision from the script stage, the road to production, composition and visual choices throughout principal photography, and a director's involvement in post production. The presentation will be intertwined with a live Q&A with attendees. The workshop is open to anyone working on their technique as a director.

Ashley is a filmmaker and passionate, longtime equestrian. She is the writer, director and editor of BLACK

BEAUTY (2020) for Disney+, starring Oscar winner Kate Winslet, Mackenzie Foy, and Jain Glen.

Black Beauty will mark Ashley's fourth feature film, in addition to directing hundreds of commercials and branded content to date.

Upcoming projects include writing directing CITY OF ANGELS for Warner Bros. & Perez Pictures, with Charles Roven and Paul Perez producing; as well as directing the time traveling love story THE SUMMER OF IMPOSSIBLE THINGS based on the novel by Rowan Coleman.

On the television side, Ashley is writing and show running the television series BREYER HOLLOW for Imagine Entertainment's Executive Producers Ron Howard, Brian Grazer, and Stephanie Sperber.

An editor of over a decade, she cuts the majority of her own work, including Disney's BLACK BEAUTY and her documentary, WILD BEAUTY. The wild horses of South Dakota along with Yvette Running Horse Collin, PhD an Oglala Lakota researcher and scientist, are at the forefront of wild horse DNA research.

In the fall of 2020, Ashley founded and launched The Wild Beauty Foundation—a nonprofit organization that hopes to illuminate key issues wild and domestic horses are facing today through entertainment, educational programs for children and teens, and on the ground rescue efforts of horses in need.

Ashley lives near the ocean with her husband and producing partner Edward Winters, and is the co-founder of Winterstone Pictures.

In his acting workshop, Justin Johnson Cortez will discuss his personal approach to acting. He will introduce the methods and techniques he uses when exploring new material and characters. Attendees will have the opportunity to participate in the very exercises Justin utilizes to discover the heart of each character he takes on.

The Hispanic and Indigenous American actor/writer/director rose to prominence in 2022 as one of the year's hottest new talents, starring in The CW's highest rated new series "Walker Independence" from executive producer Jared Padalecki. Set in the late-1800's as a preguel to The

CW's number one rated hit-series "Walker," Johnson Cortez stars as Calian, an Apache tribe member working as a scout for the city of Independence, Texas.

Johnson Cortez worked directly with an Apache translator for the role, receiving blessings from Apache Elders for his commitment to authentic representation of the Native tribe indigenous to the Southwestern United States. In addition to script translations and overseeing Native storylines, he also performs his own stunts, marking his territory as an expert horse rider and action star in the making.

Johnson Cortez stars in the 2023 BHFF feature film "Gift of Fear," highlighting a major crisis devastating Native populations. The film became a deeply personal and important project for the Native cast and crew as the film brings awareness to an epidemic vastly underreported in today's media: the kidnapping and sex trafficking of young Indigenous women.

He has also guest-starred on such series as "911: Lone Star," "Lucifer," and served as actor/writer/director/producer in the short film "The Fall," which was a 2020 Skins Fest official selection. A Santa Paula, California native of Yaqui Tribe descent, Johnson Cortez is a true handyman, adventure-seeking athlete and artist at heart. He enjoys using his hands to build custom furniture, riding motorcycles, and creating art and stencil work out of wood blocks; as well as spending time with his wife Rachel and two daughters, Olivia and Evelyn.






